BUSINESS REPORT

Mr. Losekamp reported that the Hamilton County Rural Planning Commission approved the Harrison Township Comprehensive Land Use Plan on October 10th, 2018. The next step is to obtain approval from the Hamilton County Commissioners.

Mr. Losekamp reported that he met with Hamilton County Sheriff, Jim Neil, and Chief Deputy Mark Schoonover on October 8th 2018 to discuss the continued patrols in Harrison Township in light of potential budget cuts. The Sheriff's Department will not allow our citizens, in any event, to be without patrols. Response times might be slower than normal. The Sheriff's Department said they will stay in touch.

Mr. Losekamp reported that the construction of the pickle ball courts went out to bid. Mr. Losekamp will report back with further information next month.

Mr. Losekamp reported that the bid was awarded for the Community Center parking lots. The winning bid was \$84,000.00 which will be primarily funded with a \$70,000.00 community block grant. The remaining portion of \$14,000.00 will be shared equally between Harrison Township and the City of Harrison. The project will take approximately 2-3 days and should be completed by the end of November, 2018.

Mr. Losekamp reported that we obtained an estimate from Hendy, Inc. to repair sections of Farmland Drive in the amount of \$34,500.00. Mr. Dole made a motion to approve the commencement of the road project. Mr. Noes seconded the motion, roll call - all yea.

Mr. Losekamp reported that the Kerr family has requested to add two properties to the Harrison Township/City of Harrison Joint Economic Development District. A public hearing will be held to discuss this request on November 14th, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. at the Harrison Community Center.

Mr. Noes asked about the status of the Shield Radar Speed Display. Mr. Losekamp stated that it is not in service yet because he needs to coordinate training with the Harrison Police Department
