MINUTES OF HARRISON TOWNSHIP BOARD TRUSTEES REGULAR MEETING

OPENING

The Harrison Township Board of Trustees met in regular session with Chairman, Thomas C. Losekamp, calling the meeting to order. Answering the roll call were: Frederick A. Dole, Thomas C. Losekamp and Mark A. Louis.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Dole made a motion to approve the minutes of the December 21, 2022 regular meeting. Mr. Louis seconded the motion, roll call – all yea.

FISCAL OFFICER'S REPORT

Mr. Louis made a motion to approve the Fiscal Officer's Financial Report, which includes the payment of the bills. Mr. Losekamp seconded the motion, roll call – all yea.

VISITORS

Deborah Kastens representing the Ditch the Dump organization gave an update on the status of the Bond Road landfill and decisions made by the Hamilton County Commissioners. She asked the board to carefully review the proposed tier use of the landfill presented by Rumpke.

Joe Forbeck asked the Board to consider a noise resolution for guns being fired in the Township. Mr. Losekamp stated that a noise resolution is being reviewed and will ask legal counsel to review the section on the discharging of guns to make sure it will be addressed.

POLICE REPORT

Sgt. Oliver Albert of the Hamilton County Sheriff's office reported that there were several incidents in Harrison Township. There was 1 auto theft, 1 violation of protection order, 1 breaking and entering and 1 Telecommunicatitons Harassment cases for the month of December. There was a total of 8 auto crashes. There were 154 calls for service in Harrison Township during this period. Deputies responded to 83 of those calls for service and logged out 71 calls for service due to Be On the Look Of, public services, EMS etc. The average response time to responded calls for service was 10 minutes, which down 2 minutes from last month.

FIRE REPORT

Mr. Louis reported he was informed by the fire department about an accident involving the Township Fire Truck. More details will become available but it appears the damage is minor.
